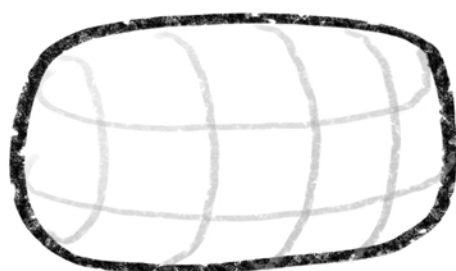


# SCULPTING WITH PLAY-DOH

Howdy! My name is Annie Wong (黄安琪) and today I'm going to show you how to sculpt an ox. All you need is a toothpick and Play-Doh.

First, use the template above by pressing the Play-Doh on top of the ox body parts and filling in the shapes. I use white, pink, yellow, and black Play-Doh to make the shapes, but you are welcome to use your favorite colors!

The next page shows you how to attach the pieces together. You can also watch the short demonstration video I made to see how I did it!

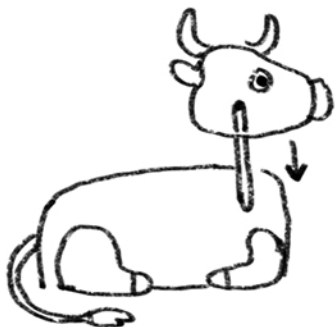

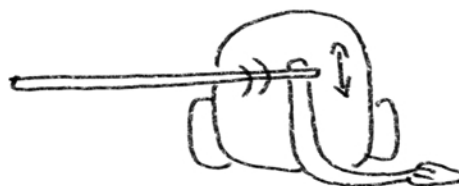
1. Press the legs, arms, and tail to the ox's body.



2. Press the nose, eyes, pupils, horns, and ears to the ox head.



3. Break the toothpick in half and insert 1 half into the head. Press the head with the toothpick into to the body.



4. You can use the other half of the toothpick against the Play-Doh to help smooth two parts together.



5. You can use that same toothpick half to poke holes in the nose and and indent the ox hooves.



6. Add spots! These can be whatever shape or color you want!
